





LOCAL FOOD PURCHASE ASSISTANCE



- A 3-year "Farm to Food Assistance" program of USDA-AMS.
- Improve food system resiliency.
- Serves feeding programs such as food banks, schools, nonprofit and communitybased organizations serving rural, remote, and underserved individuals.
- Expand economic impact for local food producers; prioritizing socially disadvantaged groups.






PARTICIPATION & DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM YEAR 2







LEPA: TIMELINE

- Dec. 6th 2021: USDA -AMS releases Request for Proposals from States.
- 2022: AZ partners conduct focus groups and prepare proposal.
- Oct. 2022: Award notice received.
- Apr. 2023: funding becomes accessible.
- Oct. 2024: USDA announces another round of 3 yr LFPA funding.
- Feb. 2025: USDA terminates "LFPA 25"



LOOKING AHEAD: TRANSITIONS

- March 2026: Marks the end of LFPA funding.
- Exploring alternatives to sustain support for local food purchasing.
- Tracking national policies.


